

CRITERION WISE SUMMARY

1. CURRICULAR ASPECTS

CMCS College is affiliated to Savitribai Phule Pune University, Pune. The college was following the curriculum framed by Savitribai Phule Pune University, Pune from time to time. The Curriculum framed by the Board of Studies for each program faculty of university, which consisting of senior faculty members, academicians from other institutions and industry experts to prepare draft syllabus and reviews after getting feedback from all the stakeholders.

The calendar of events for each semester will be prepared by the institute as per university guidelines by including weekly working days, holidays, internal assessment test dates, practical exam dates, Technical Seminar/Workshop schedule, industrial visit dates, sports day, cultural day, graduation day, last working day of the semester along with tentative dates for semester end examinations. The calendar of events will be prepared through strategic plan of the institute. The Continuous Internal Evaluation will be effectively conducted by all the departments, which will be monitored by the College Examination Officer (CEO) of the institute. The question paper for the semester end examination will be prepared by the experienced teachers from the institute along with external papers received by the other institutions. The question paper follows the Choice Based credit System (CBCS), which provides flexibility in framing the curriculum. Institute strongly believes in integrating professional ethics, gender equality, human values and environmental sustainability with a view to ensure holistic development of the students. Covid 19 pandemic has changed the way of teaching. It enables us to reach out to students more efficiently and effectively through whatsapp chat groups, video meetings and also online tools for document sharing like Google classroom.

2. TEACHING - LEARNING & EVALUATION

The institution follows admission process to all the programs, both UG and PG as per Rules and Regulations of the Government of Maharashtra. The students admitted come from different background and hence a Student Induction Program on General subjects, English Communication and personality development will be conducted for newly admitted students before the actual commencement of regular classes.

The institution has dedicated, well qualified and experienced faculty with doctoral degree and many are pursuing their research. The institution has a student-teacher ratio of 1:34 for effective teaching and mentoring. In covid-19 pandemic, online education became a pedagogical shift from traditional method to the modern approach of teaching-learning from classroom to Zoom, from personal to virtual and from seminars to webinars. Teachers and students are motivated to adapt online teaching-learning platforms in fulfilling the current educational needs. Everyone, either teachers or students, were friendly skilled in using social media app viz. WhatsApp, Facebook, Twitter, Instagram, which turned into smooth facilitation of using online educational platforms such as ZOOM, Cisco WebEx, Google Meet etc. as a sign of positive transfer of learning. The action plan was prepared, keeping in view of our readiness for online teaching mode, drive for change in this pandemic and availability of resources for implementing online teaching mode. To go with the action plan, teachers prepared and trained themselves independently to be accustomed to the technology required in using online teaching modes. Besides, teachers attended technology-based teaching programmes conducted by different universities in collaboration with the UGC during the lockdown period. It was found patience on the part of all the stakeholders including the faculty, students, academic administrators, and support staff would go a long way in managing the transition. At the college level, experts provided necessary assistance to stakeholders and managing the change process.

The academic calendar detailing the events of entire semester is prepared accordingly to facilitate teaching-learning strategies to intend learning outcomes. The subject for the teacher will be allotted based on the preference before the commencement of semester. Teachers will prepare the lesson plan and course material for the same. The student centric methods like experimental learning, participative learning and problem solving methods are employed for enhancing learning experiences for effective teaching-learning. The institute adopts the streamlined mechanism for the continuous evaluation of the students through Continuous Internal Evaluation. The student grievances related to assessment are addressed in transparent, time-bound and efficient manner. The average pass percentage of final year students is more than 96.70%, which serves as the evidence of the excellence in performance.

3. RESEARCH, INNOVATIONS & EXTENTIONS

MVP Samaj's CMCS College has established Research coordination committee to conduct all the research activities inculcating research culture among students and faculty members. Empowerment of knowledge is achieved with strong theoretical knowledge, interdisciplinary skills, creativity, innovation, and hands on expertise and professional ethics. Research activities in the institute foster these needs. Institute has also made financial provisions to cater the needs of research. The Institution provides support to its faculty members for their overall growth and development. They are granted leave and are sponsored for seminars, workshops and conferences at National and International level. In the pandemic situations, a online webinar were conducted by college. Institute has MOUs with many industries and organizations.

Research committee looks into every matter associated with motivation, facilities, guidance in research work. 6 college teachers are pursuing Ph.D. in their respective discipline. Total 13 research papers published in national/international journals, 2 papers presented in national/international conferences. Every year different social activities have been conducted to bring social awareness among the college students. To make students aware about the environment, workshop likes making Ganpati from Shadu Mati conducted by college. Various extensions activities like blood donation camp, tree plantation, etc was conducted at college.

4. INFRASTRUCTURE & LEARNING RESOURCES

MVPS, Commerce Management and Computer Science (CMCS) College is situated in beautifully landscaped campus of Maratha Vidya Prasarak Samaj, Nashik. The college is approved by UGC and affiliated to SPPU. Since its establishment in 2006, college has maintained high standards for infrastructure and learning resources. Spacious, well-lit and well-ventilated 12 classrooms and 02 air-conditioned ICT class rooms with Interactive smart board are available for smooth conduct of theory sessions. One seminar hall used to arrange various programs and activities of college. With the growth of the institution we are in progress of the construction of our second floor for fulfilling the increasing demands required to ease for teaching and Learning.

Besides the conventional teaching aids, classrooms are also equipped with ICT facility like LCD projectors. The college has well-maintained 04 air-conditioned laboratories with IT related facilities. The college has separate infrastructure facilities for NSS Cell, BSD Cell, Research Cell, Training and Placement Cell and Health Center. Ramp is available for differently-abled students. For security and surveillance college has CCTV facility. The college has solar system with capacity of 15 KW. Library is well-equipped with modern facilities (AutoLib software by IT Software Nasik). The College has a Library Advisory Committee which supports the functioning of the library. The library has 7318 Books, 30+ journals, subscribed NLIST and 11 Newspapers for reference. Library has separate e-library with high speed internet, Reading Room with 120 seating capacity and teachers reading room. The college has gymkhana, 03 Sports grounds for outdoor/indoor games. Gymkhana has 6 stations Gym, Multi- workout bench and other equipment. All computers are connected LAN with internet bandwidth speed of 100 mbps and also include UPS, Server facilities.

5. STUDENT SUPPORT AND PROGRESSION

The college provides good student support services in various forms to facilitate the Personality development, motivation and confidence building of students. Every year Students from SC, ST, and OBC etc. category are receiving financial assistance from the Central Government and State Government of Maharashtra.

Capability enhancement courses for competitive examinations, Career counseling, Soft skill development, Remedial coaching, Personal Counseling are offered to all the students. Institute has effective and efficient system for overall development of students. Institute has various committees such as Student Grievance Cell, Anti Ragging Cell to address student grievances. Institution maintains grievance addressing system having sensitive to student needs.

The teaching-learning process is enhanced by various activities such as Expert lectures, Industrial Visits, Workshops and seminars to provide exposure to students to real life practical aspects. Students are made aware of various opportunities after graduation. Various training sessions are conducted for career guidance and entrepreneurship development. Training and Placement Cell, plays vital role in conducting expert lectures, training sessions for students.

The Institute organizes various co-curricular and extracurricular activities in cultural and sports events which eventually help the students to show their talent.

The institute has registered Alumni. Alumni of the institution actively work for the guidance to students and their placement. The institution has a very good student support and progression mechanism that includes scholarship benefits, career guidance and internship opportunities. CMCS has Alumni association through which guidance will be provided for students.

For the fulfillment of fundamental duties regarding constitutional obligations the institute always celebrates Independence Day, Republic Day, Birth and Death Anniversaries of famous identities. FUTURE PLANS OF ACTION OF IQAC

Maratha Vidya Prasarak Samaj's CMCS College always planned for higher level of excellence. CMCS has got the very well structured IQAC action plan to achieve the mission and vision of the institution.

IQAC of CMCS has equipped with following Action Plan.

- Applied for permanent affiliation: The College is working hard to get a
 permanent affiliation so as to institute will get recognized under section 2(f)
 and eligible to receive central assistance under Section 12B of the UGC Act,
 1956. This will help in applying for additional courses. The faculty members
 can get opportunity apply for major and minor research.
- 2. Widen up Infra structure: The College has huge infrastructure. In addition to the same the college is planning to increase the teaching learning facilities for students and faculty members. We are planning to increase the number of PC for computer labs. Improve required infrastructure like furniture, apparatus, chemical, and other physical equipments for Electronics lab, Physics lab, Botany lab, Zoology lab, and Microbiology lab. We are also in planning for new acoustic room for recording; this will ease the creating ICT materials for students to further strengthen the ICT in teaching and learning. We are also planning to take initiatives for an ecofriendly learning space.
- 3. Effective Implementation of Mentoring System at College: Teacher as mentor plays a crucial role in mentoring students. Students and their mentors share responsibility for ensuring productive and rewarding mentoring relationships. The importance of integrating the system for enhancing student's performance is a common resolution adopted by a meeting of the teaching faculty. The system was promptly and effectively put into practice after it was first resolved in 2021.

- 4. Increase tie ups or linkages: The College aims at increasing tie ups and linkages with various NGOs, Rural Schools, Underdeveloped villages etc. with the view of implementing best practices of the college and fulfilling needs accordingly. To have more industry academic interface so that there is more corporate participation in academia
- 5. Significant improvement in feedback, analysis and action to be taken System: To build relationships based on mutual trust, benefits and to enhance long-term overall effectiveness of an organization. We are going to Design and develop mechanism to collect feedback from stakeholders. Analyses of feedback collected and do the corrective measures accordingly by the college concerned authorities.
